NOTICE OF RACE

Posted April 23, 2017

(This Notice of Race may be amended pursuant to rule 89.2b)

The regatta will be organized by Big Blue Sailing Academy (“BBSA”) in conjunction with the U.S. Optimist Dinghy Association (the “USODA”), *collectively* known as the organizing authority (OA).

1. RULES

- 1.1. The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing* (RRS).
- 1.2. “USODA Conditions for Sanctioned Regattas and Championships,” including the USODA ‘Code of Conduct,’ will apply, and can be found at www.usoda.org. Competitors and all *Support Persons*, as defined by RRS, shall abide by the USODA ‘Code of Conduct’. This includes behavior both on and off the water including respect for all other persons, personal property of others, Old Dominion University (ODU), Norfolk Yacht and Country Club (NYCC), and the City of Norfolk, VA.
- 1.3. Rule 61 is changed as follows:
 - (a) The red protest flag required in Rule 61.1(a) shall be attached to the sailor’s lifejacket in a manner that allows it to be concealed before it is needed and after the protested boat has acknowledged her foul.
 - (b) Rule 61.1(a)(2) is deleted.
 - (c) The following new rule is added to rule 61:

61.5 Informing the Race Committee

In addition to meeting the requirements of rule 61.1, a boat intending to protest another boat concerning an incident in the racing area that she is involved in or sees shall, at the first reasonable opportunity after she finishes, notify the race committee measurement boat of her intent to protest and the sail number of the boat(s) she is protesting.

- 1.4. Appendix P will apply. P2.2, “Second Penalty” will be changed to, “Second and Subsequent Penalties.” There will also be an addition to the end of the first sentence, “unless her penalty is signaled after she finishes, in which case she shall promptly notify the race committee measurement boat that she is retiring.” P2.3 will be deleted.
- 1.5. In addition to the requirements of RRS 40 and its US Sailing prescription, a condition of entry and participation in this regatta is the wearing of a U.S. Coast Guard approved lifejacket, or for international competitors only, a lifejacket approved by their country’s corresponding national authority, properly secured at all times while on the water, except for brief periods while removing or



adding clothing. All lifejackets must be suitable for the competitor's weight. Wet suits, dry suits, and inflatable lifejackets do not constitute adequate personal buoyancy. Failure to wear a proper lifejacket will result in a penalty up to and including disqualification at the discretion of the protest committee. This changes RRS 40 and RRS Part 4 Preamble.

2. ADVERTISING

- 2.1. Advertising is restricted per World Sailing Regulation 20.5.1, 20.4 and Table 1.
- 2.2. Boats may be required to display sponsor advertising chosen and supplied by the OA.

3. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 3.1. International Optimist Dinghies may enter by completing online registration, paying all entry fees, and completing the Measurement Form and the USODA Boat Self-Certification Safety Checklist.
- 3.2. The Red, Blue and White Fleet assignments will be based on the competitor's age on the first day of the regatta July 28, 2017.
- 3.3. All competitors shall be female members of their respective National Class Association (NCA), such as the USODA and have been born on or after January 1, 2002. The OA may require satisfactory proof of such membership and age. Competitors who are not USODA members are invited to join USODA by selecting Membership found in the left margin of www.usoda.org. Members of other IODA organizations and NCAs need to email at usoda@usoda.org for a login ID and password.

4. REGISTRATION AND ENTRY FEES

- 4.1. All entry fees shall be paid during online registration at www.usoda.org.
 - a) The entry fee is U.S. \$40 if paid by Friday, June 30, 2017.
 - b) A late fee of U.S. \$25 (\$65 total) shall be paid for registrations completed July 1 through July 7.
 - c) An additional late fee of \$25 (\$90 total) shall be paid for registrations completed July 8 through 1700 EDT July 14.
- 4.2. Registration shall be done online at www.usoda.org in the Members Only area accessed via login ID and password. Competitors shall have completed **all** parts of the online registration including completion on the online Waiver and Medical forms in order to be registered for the event. Each competitor shall confirm their registration by checking the entry list on the Event Registration page. If a competitor is not listed on the USODA website, then the competitor is not registered and the late fees described above will apply. **Entry Fees are NON-REFUNDABLE and may not be transferred to another USODA event.**
- 4.3. Registration will be closed **July 14, 2017 at 1700 hours EDT.**
- 4.4. Requests to register after registration has closed are subject to approval by the OA.

5. FORMAT OF THE REGATTA

This is a one day Girls National Championship and boats will race in a single fleet.

6. SCHEDULE

- 6.1. Each Sailor shall be present at Check-In. The USODA Measurement Form and USODA Self-Certification Safety Checklist are required to complete Check-In.



- 6.2. Continental breakfast and lunch will be provided to competitors on the scheduled race day. Lunch will be available for pickup prior to the harbor start.
- 6.3. Program and Schedule

- 6.4. Five (5) race are scheduled.

7. MEASUREMENT

- 7.1. Competitors are allowed to use only one hull, dagger board, rudder (with tiller and extension), mast, boom, sprit and sail during the regatta. Substitution of such equipment shall occur only with the written or verbal approval of the Principal Race Officer (PRO).
- 7.2. Each competitor shall submit a USODA Measurement Form during the regatta site Check-In. This form shall inform the race committee that all equipment is present and in compliance with Class Rules.
- 7.3. **Equipment** previously measured and stickered with an IODA decal, a USODA measurement decal or stamped pursuant to the USODA measurement process which remains unaltered since the measurement may be self-certified as part of the measurement process. Each competitor shall sign a statement attesting that any previously measured or stamped equipment has not been modified since the date it was measured.
- 7.4. Equipment not previously measured and approved by the USODA shall meet class measurement requirements prior to being available for use in the regatta, and shall be measured and approved during Measurement.
- 7.5. **All sails shall be removed from the boom for inspection**, and stamped by a Technical Committee (Measurement) Official (TCO) with the 2017 USODA Nationals signature regardless of previous regatta stamps or signatures.
- 7.6. Boats may be subject to a safety inspection at any time during the regatta.
- 7.7. The race and/or protest committee reserves the right to measure equipment and/or sails at any time regardless of whether it has been previously measured.



8. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Preliminary sailing instructions may be available online. Final official sailing instructions will be available onsite at check-in and on the USODA website.

9. VENUE AND BERTHING

- 9.1. The racing area will be in the Elizabeth River near the mouth of the Lafayette River and east of Craney Island Reach.
- 9.2. All Optimist boats shall be kept at the ODU Sailing Center in the assigned area.
- 9.3. Registered coach boats, (no boat trailers) may be berthed at NYCC as directed by the harbor master.
- 9.4. Coach and spectator boats shall NOT be launched from the ODU Sailing Center ramp.

10. THE COURSE

The course will be included in the sailing instructions.

11. SCORING

- 11.1. The Low Point Scoring System of rule Appendix A will apply as revised by this Notice of Race. The number of boats entered in the Championship will be defined as the number of registered boats which subsequently completed competitor Check-In at the regatta venue. See NOR 6.1. This modifies rule A4.2.
- 11.2. One (1) completed race shall constitute the regatta.
- 11.3. Scoring based on number of races completed:
 - a) When fewer than five (5) races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of all of her race scores.
 - b) When five (5) races have been completed, a boats score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

12. SAFETY

- 12.1. Each competitor shall have a whistle attached to their lifejacket at all times while on the water.
- 12.2. Each boat shall have a secure loop in the end its bow line.

13. ADULT RESPONSIBILITY

- 13.1. An adult (parent, guardian or designated adult) is responsible for the safety of their competitor. It is the responsibility solely of this adult to decide if the sailor should sail in the weather and sea conditions that might arise during the event. The adults supervising the competitors are ultimately responsible for the risks.
- 13.2. Parents not personally attending any part of the event shall ensure that another adult is authorized and designated to make these decisions for their competitor.
- 13.3. Each competitor shall indicate in writing at Check-In the parent or adult representative that will be responsible for the competitor throughout the event.
- 13.4. The designated adult shall accept full responsibility for all actions of the competitor during any activity related to the event. This includes on-shore activities before, during, and after the regatta.



14. COACH AND SUPPORT BOATS (PARENT OR SPECTATOR)

- 14.1. The OA strongly recommends that each sailor have a coach or support (parent or spectator) boat on the race course throughout the regatta.
- 14.2. One coach boat for every seven (7) sailors and fraction thereof from a sailing program may be registered. (For example, a program with eight (8) sailors would be allowed to register two coach boats.) Requests for an additional coach boat shall be emailed to usoda@usoda.org by July 24, 2017 and are subject to USODA Regatta Committee approval.
- 14.3. All coach and support (parent or spectator) boats shall register (see NOR 6.3) and promptly display a numbered flag supplied by the OA while on the water. A \$20 security deposit will be required which will be returned at the end of the event with the return of the flag.
- 14.4. Each coach boat shall have a working VHF radio and monitor the radio, an anchor suitable for anchoring in the waiting area, and a basic first aid kit.
- 14.5. The conduct of coaches, parents serving on race committee (including safety patrol), registered support boats, and all other boats will be governed by the sailing instructions and RRS.

15. PRIZES

Prizes will be given as follows:

- Overall: 1st through 5th
- Red Fleet: 1st through 3rd
- Blue Fleet: 1st through 3rd
- White Fleet: 1st through 3rd

Maggie Wake Perpetual Trophy

Additional awards and prizes may be presented at the sole discretion of the OA, and may be based on criteria other than the regatta.

16. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

- 16.1. Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race.
- 16.2. The OA will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta. An online waiver shall be signed by all competitors and their parent/guardian, in accordance with NOR 4.2.
